Use the local event of the fire at St Hilary's Church in Wallasey as a comparison. Settlements, location	Flight and significant Individuals – Wright Brothers,, Amelia Earheart, Catherine Johnson, Neil Armstrong, Tim Peake, Richard Branson Find out about the lives of significant individuals in the past and present who have contributed to the creation and development of flight. Research the achievements of Neil Armstrong, Catherine Johnson and Tim Peake and how they have shaped space travel. Find out how Richard Branson is contributing to space tourism.
