Geographical vocabulary:

Base Map	A base map is a layer with geographic information that serves as a background.
City	Large settlements - they usually have lots of amenities and sometimes a cathedral too
Detached	A house which does not share an outside
Field Sketch	A simplistic drawing of a particular location
Fieldwork	Practical work conducted by a researcher in the natural environment
Hamlet	A collection of houses, perhaps centered around a few farms and maybe without even a shop
Human Feature	Features of land that have been impacted by human activity
Land Use	The purpose for which an area of land is
Physical Feature	Natural features of land not impacted upon
Semi-detached	A house that shares an outside wall
Settlement	A settlement is a place where people live.
Town	Medium-sized settlements - thousands of people live in them and they have a shopping centre and factories
Village	Several hundred people live in them with a few shops, a place of worship and maybe a school too
